

Building Patient Care: Status of Project

Timelines:

- Hospital redevelopment announced
 - March 2013 by Premier Clark
 - August 2013 re-confirmed by Minister Lake
- Early 2014 business plan completion
 - Procurement of construction "following approval of the business case", Mar 2013 Premier Clark
- 2015 Construction, "shovels in the ground.. within a couple of years", August 2013 Minister Lake
- Capital cost sharing for equipment and building
 - 47% Communities and Citizens (estimate \$140M)
 - \$20M South Okanagan Similkameen Hospital Foundation
 - \$120M Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen
 - 53% Province (estimate \$160M)

Patient Care Demands Growing



- Designed for population of 10,500... now services over 90,000
- Population over 65 growing rapidly
- Second only in elderly per capita to White Rock
- Median age is 53.2 years compared to 41.9 for province

- Lowest cost per patient day in 90% of the nursing units in Interior Health
- 80% of all surgeries are day surgery

- Designated as an "A" priority capital project by Interior Health and endorsed by the Province
- Consistent with Ministry of Health vision of system sustainability
 - focus on wellness not illness
 - integrates community and prehospital care
 - eases the demand on acute care beds
- Creates and protects jobs for families
 - Hundreds of direct and indirect jobs during construction
 - Will assist in recruiting and retaining skilled health care professionals
 - Provides essential health care facilities for future demands

 - Co-locates key services and professionals in a single location
 - Enhances infection control
