

RESOURCES:

An Incident Management Team, 134 firefighters, five helicopters, 46 structure protection personnel, 26 pieces of heavy equipment and numerous other support positions are working on the Nk'Mip Creek wildfire. In total, there are 244 personnel currently committed to the response operation.

On Sunday evening, 98 firefighters from Mexico arrived with two agency representatives and an administrative support resource. They have received their operational and safety briefings and have begun work on the fireline. Kx Hall, a host with Osoyoos Indian Band, welcomed the personnel to the traditional lands of the Syilx People with a prayer and drumming.

UPDATE:

Fire growth has been observed and aerial mapping has been requested but due to smoke conditions and fire behaviour, a track has not been able to be completed. Fire activity has been moderate with mostly surface fire and some trees torching. The fire is still active but not as challenging. Heavy equipment has made good progress on the eastern cat guard. Firefighting personnel and heavy equipment remain on site overnight doing structure protection.



OBJECTIVES:

Branch A will be assessing and falling danger trees on the north side of the fire. Crews will continue to patrol and mop up around residential areas near McKinney Rd, Nk'Mip Rd and Shrike Hill, burning off any unburnt fuel, reinforcing existing guards and extinguishing hotspots <u>FireSmart</u> work on properties is ongoing. By removing available fuels from within home ignition zones and around facilities, fires are less likely to impact interface areas.

Branch Z is continuing structure protection near the Anarchist Mountain community. Patrols and mop up continue on the fire's southern perimeter. Crews are constructing and reinforcing hand guard to tie into machine guards on the fires south edge and eastward. There was a small excursion over the fire guard near Bullmoose Rd which crews are working to contain.

Heavy equipment is progressing with guard assessment and line construction near Shrike and the contingency line near Mt Baldy and Sidley Meadows. Equipment is also being utilized to supply water for facility protection.







FORECAST:

Yesterday, skies stayed smoky in the vicinity of the Nk'Mip Creek Wildfire. Winds were light and variable until the evening when they shifted downslope and continued as such until this morning, keeping the fire active. Smoke is expected to lift as the day progresses.



Today, temperatures will be around 30 degrees Celsius and relative humidity val-
