

### EVACUATION ALERT – <u>September 18, 2023, 1200 hrs</u> Glen Lake Wildfire K53294

An **EVACUATION ALERT** has been issued by the <u>Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen</u> due to the threat of wildfire.

Because of the potential danger to life and health, the <u>Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen</u> has issued an **EVACUATION ALERT** for the addresses listed in Schedule 1 in **Electoral Area "F" and Electoral Area "H"**:

 Within Electoral Area "H" and Electoral Area "F" along the Regional District of Central Okanagan and Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen border from Headwaters Road to Darke Lake Provincial Park, south across Fish Lake Road to the Electrical Power right of way, and northwest to Trout Creek Mainline Road.

An Evacuation Alert has been issued to prepare you to evacuate your premises or property should it be found necessary.

Residents will be given as much advance notice as possible prior to evacuation; however, you may receive limited notice due to changing conditions.



#### WHAT YOU SHOULD DO:

- Prepare for the evacuation order.
- Locate all family members and designate a meeting area outside the evacuation area, should an Evacuation Order be called while separated.
- Arrange accommodation for all members of the residence with family or friends, if possible – commercial/hotel accommodation may not be available.
- Pack essential items such as:
  - government-issued ID
  - medications
  - eyeglasses
  - valuable papers (e.g. insurance, credit, and mortgage information)
  - immediate care needs for dependents and
  - if time and space permits, keepsakes for quick departure.
- Prepare to move disabled persons, children and/or neighbors, if assistance is needed.
  - Consider evacuating, call the ESS at 250-486-1890 to discuss your options.
- Prepare to take pets with you and move livestock to a safe area (if possible).
  - Pet owners and hobby farmers with concerns for their animals may contact:
    - Animal Emergency Response Team (ALERT): 250-809-7152
  - Commercial Farmers contact the RDOS EOC 250-490-4225
- Arrange transportation for all your household members.
  - Fill the gas tanks of personal vehicles.
  - If transportation assistance is needed, contact the RDOS EOC 250-490-4225.

- Please store your Fire Arms in accordance with Section 118 of the Fire Arms Act.
- Wait for an Evacuation Order to be issued before evacuating. Monitor news sources including Voyent Alert.
- Pre-register at ess.gov.bc.ca
  - You will need to either attend a reception center or call 250-486-1890 if the ALERT is expanded to an ORDER for immediate ESS services.

Emergency Support Services (ESS) is a safety net program available when alternatives such as family, friends, and insurance cannot be accessed. ESS is not offered if insurance is accessible. In situations where insurance exits, but cannot be immediately accessed, interim support may be provided.
