Atmospheric weather event, Electoral Area “H”: Evacuation Alert RESCINDED

The Evacuation Alert issued by the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen Emergency Operations Centre (RDOS EOC) on December 10, 2025, for the following area has been RESCINDED:
