How do I have a voice in RDOS decisions?

In addition to the Area "D" electoral area Director, residents can participate in decision-making by being appointed to an Area "D" Commission or proposing services to meet their own local needs.

Area "D" Advisory Planning Commission

- Independent body of 11 voting members
- Appointed by RDOS Board
- Members hold 4-year term (applications solicited at term end)
- Provides advice to the Board on land use matters like development applications
- All meetings are open to the public

Recreation Commissions

- Kaleden Recreation Commission has 8 voting members
- Okanagan Falls Recreation Commission has 9 voting members
- Appointed by RDOS Board
- Members hold a 2-year term (applications solicited at term end)
- Provide advice to RDOS Board and staff regarding parks and recreation
- All meetings are open to the public
- Oversee an operating budget (determined by RDOS Board)

Want a new service? Propose one!

- Have an idea for a service not provided in your community?
 - 1. Talk to RDOS staff to see if it is possible
 - 2. Talk to neighbours and determine support for the service idea
 - 3. Discuss process for assessing feasibility
 - including scope, cost and delivery options
 - 4. A service bylaw must receive support from the Regional District Board and the residents that will participate in and pay for the service
