

PROHIBIT ENTRY ORDER



Bald Range Wildfire (K51490)

August 31, 2026 at 17:00 (5:00 p.m.)

Faulder, South Meadow Valley and Callan Road, Electoral Area "F"

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- Specified properties within Faulder, Electoral Area "F";
- 26 Marsh Lane, 155 Marsh Lane and 464 Fish Lake Road, Electoral Area "F";
- 351 Callan Road and 365 Callan Road, Electoral Area "F".

Whereas a declaration of a state of local emergency was declared on **August 7, 2026** by the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen pursuant to Section 95 of the *Emergency and Disaster Management Act* due to wildfire impacts within the Electoral Area "F";

And pursuant to Section 107(1)(b) of the *Emergency and Disaster Management Act*;

This **Prohibit Entry Order** has been issued by the Regional District of Okanagan-Similkameen due to the immediate and ongoing danger to life safety caused by the wildfire impacts which pose a risk to health, safety, and well-being of persons.

This Prohibit Entry Order is effective of August 31, 2026 at 5:00 p.m.

YOU MUST NOT ENTER THE AREA

Members of the local police department and other applicable agencies will be enforcing this order.

A person must not enter the area identified above for purposes of occupying or visiting the area.

Despite the above, the registered property owners, residents, designate of a resident or registered property owner, or peoples authorized by the RDOS may enter and occupy the area described in this Order.



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Why is the Prohibit Entry Order necessary?

While residents are being provided with greater flexibility to manage their personal recovery, post-wildfire impacts and associated hazard assessments are ongoing. Restricting access to authorized individuals help ensure that recovery activities can continue safely, efficiently, and securely while supporting the restoration of services and infrastructure.

Limiting unnecessary traffic and activity in the affected area will:

- Protect damaged homes, properties, and infrastructure.
- Support the ongoing work of emergency responders, utility crews, contractors, and recovery personnel.
- Reduce congestion and safety risks in areas where hazards may still exist.
- Help maintain the privacy, security, and well-being of residents as they recover from the impacts of the emergency.

The RDOS appreciates the patience, resilience, and cooperation of affected residents as recovery efforts continue. These measures are intended to support property owners, protect the community, and ensure that recovery can proceed as safely and effectively as possible.

Please note that an Evacuation Order or Alert may need to be reissued; however, if that is deemed necessary, the Evacuation Order or Alert process will be recommenced.

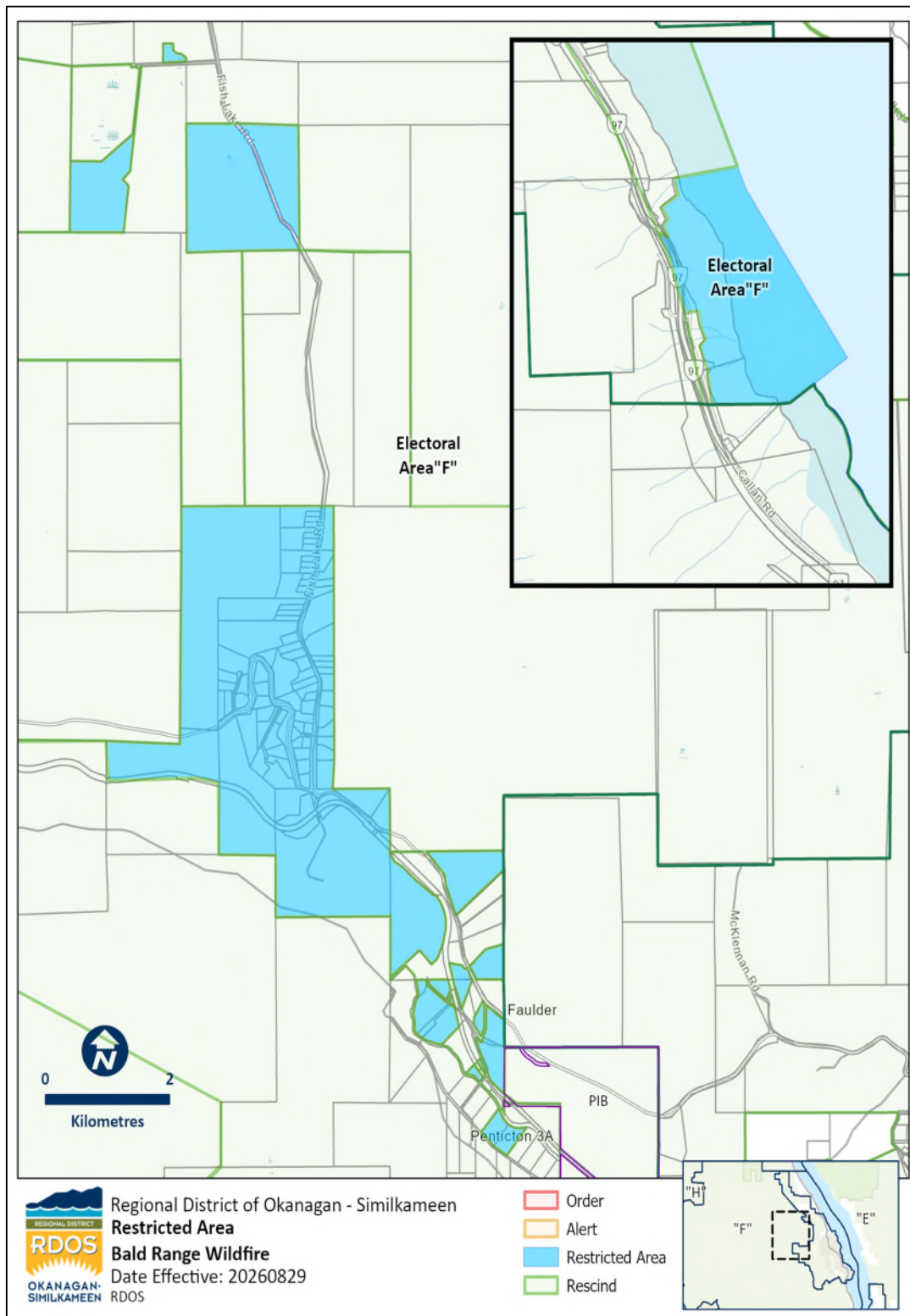
