# News and information from the Regional District December 2025



#### RDOS represented at the Union of BC Municipalities (UBCM) convention in Victoria

RDOS directors participated in several meetings with provincial representatives covering a range of issues, including rural encampments on Crown land; funding for Okanagan-Similkameen Regional Hospital District (OSRHD) capital projects; water utility and wastewater utility upgrades and acquisitions; Okanagan Falls incorporation; and direct property taxation.

RDOS directors also took part in three meetings with provincial representatives focused on the Regional District becoming a taxing authority. This would result in an estimated savings of approximately \$659,000, which the RDOS Board of Directors can use to reduce taxes, increase services, or transfer to reserves.

#### New RDOS website to launch in early 2026

The RDOS is working with Upanup to create a new website, scheduled to launch in early 2026. The website redesign is based on feedback from RDOS Regional surveys and incorporates proven practices from other local governments. The new website will feature accessibility improvements, a modernized layout, enhanced search options, and streamlined access to essential services, including emergency preparedness and water systems.



#### **RDOS pop-up offices connect with communities**

RDOS 2025 pop-up offices took place in Keremeos, Osoyoos, Oliver, Princeton, and Eastgate this September and October. The RDOS pop-up offices provide opportunities for senior staff to connect with residents from across the region. The RDOS is expanding its pop-up office initiative in 2026. Pop-up offices will be scheduled during community events whenever possible, including the Similkameen Sizzle in Keremeos and Canada Day celebrations in Okanagan Falls. The in-person community events facilitate meaningful conversations about RDOS projects and services. Dates and locations will be shared on RDOS websites, social media channels, and Voyent Alert!



#### Take Action on Radon - RDOS participates in the 100 Radon Test Kit Challenge



- Take Action on Radon is a national initiative, funded by Health Canada, to raise awareness on radon across Canada.
- Radon is the number one cause of lung cancer in non-smokers.
- The current advisory team includes the Canadian Association of Radon Scientists and Technologists (CARST) and the Canadian Cancer Society.
  - Free radon test kits were made available to residents of Electoral Area "A", "C", "F" and "H" starting in October 2026 by registering for the program.
- The Town of Osoyoos and the City of Penticton are also participating.

#### **RDOS** recreation enhancements and program success

Similkameen Recreation Centre long-term improvements

- Landscape rejuvenation project underground services, paved parking lot, tree and ground cover planting, and lighting installation for accessible pathway
- Mural expansion work is underway to expand the artwork around the building
- · Court resurfacing multi-use and squash courts are being refinished to enhance playability and safety
- Roof repairs maintenance work completed above the ice rink, refrigeration plant, and main entrance
- Facility painting bowling alley, concession area, and vestibule received fresh coats of paint

- Transit access as of September, the Similkameen Recreation Centre is now a designated bus stop for Route 50
- Accessibility improvements installation of accessible entrance doors at the recreation centre is scheduled for early 2026

In 2025, the program included 50 prescriptions distributed to health professionals, enabling residents to access activities such as swimming, yoga, gym sessions, and chair exercises. More than 20 prescriptions were used during the trial, with participants reporting improved well-being and increased awareness of local recreation services. A full-year trial is a strategic priority for 2026.

# Hazard, Risk and Vulnerability Analysis (HRVA)

The RDOS is partnering with six municipalities, four local syllx Similkameen/Okanagan communities, and all Electoral Areas to complete a Hazard, Risk and Vulnerability Analysis (HRVA) for each community. The HRVAs will inform local and regional emergency response plans, land-use policies, and climate adaptation initiatives across the RDOS. The project is grant-funded through the Province of B.C. and will take place over two years, from January 2025 to December 2026.




