The Regional District reminds residents that **Stage Normal** watering restrictions are in effect year-round or until situations change.



## The RDOS has created two, helpful items to make it easy to follow residential sprinkling regulations

The 4" x 6" magnet can be placed on a fridge or any metal surface like a filing cabinet or even some exterior doors. Place the magnet where it will cue occupants to adhere to sprinkling regulations and if applicable, to insure automatic timers are set correctly.



The 2" x 3" plastic reminder is for the most used outdoor faucet, where the hose attaches – known as a hose-bib. The envelope will contain a zap-strap to help secure it to the shaft of the faucet.
